

PPADB to charge for its services

The Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Board (PPADB) was established by an Act of Parliament as an independent authority responsible for the coordination and prudential management of public procurement of works, supplies, and services for government, and to dispose of public assets. The Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Act (Cap. 42:08) came into force on 2 July 2002.

Currently, PPADB is wholly financed by the Government, in the form of grants. This is neither desirable nor sustainable. According to Section 58 (2) of the PPADB Act, 'the costs of the Board shall, in principle, be recoverable.'

As from **1st November 2004**, PPADB will start charging for some of its services. This is in line with Government's policy on cost recovery which aims at ensuring the sustainable provision of services. Only costs associated with contractor registration are shown below. Contractors should please note that registration fees are payable on submission of application forms and are non-refundable even for applications that are rejected.
