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## **CERTIFICATION AGAINST BOS ISO 9001:2015**

Botswana Bureau of Standards (BOBS) has renewed the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Board (PPADB) BOS ISO 9001: 2015 certification license, following a full re-assessment of the latter's Quality Management System (QMS). The certification covers all PPADB processes involved in Procurement and Disposal of Government Goods, Works and Services.

In 2017, PPADB became the first organisation nationally to successfully transition from the 2008 standard to the 2015 standard, and one of the first three to be certified under the same.

The BOS ISO 9001:2015 standard represents an international consensus on good management practices with the aim of ensuring that an organisation can consistently deliver products or services that meet the customers and stakeholders' quality requirements.

The benefits that have accrued to PPADB as a result of implementing the standard include improved productivity, greater commitment toward fulfilling the customers and stakeholders' requirements and continuous improvements in service delivery. In order to ensure adherence to the certification requirements, BOBS shall conduct bi-annual surveillance audits during the three (3) year certification period which runs from August 2020 to August 2023.
