RE: COMMENCEMENT OF RE-REGISTRATION OF CONTRACTORS REGISTERED WITH PPADB AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE REVISED BASIC AND MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS FOR WORKS, SERVICES, SUPPLIES AND CONSULTANCY

- 1. The Public Procurement and Asset Disposal Board (PPADB) is mandated in terms of Section 122 of the Public Procurement and Asset Disposal (PPAD) Act to review the register of contractors bi-annually and upgrade active contractors and strike off the register any non-active contractors unless they re-apply to remain on the register for good and sufficient cause. The objective is to improve efficiency in the procurement system by ensuring that active contractors are available for the Procuring Entities (PE's) during tendering.
- To this end, the Board wishes to inform members of the public and the bidding community that the re-registration shall commence in the financial year 2018/2019. The exact commencement date will be communicated to the contractors following completion of the consultation workshops.
- The bidding community is therefore cordially invited to attend the scheduled consultation workshops as follows;
 - Gaborone on the 24th July, 2018 at Cresta Lodge
 - Francistown on the 31st July, 2018 at Cresta Thapama b.
 - Maun on the 2nd August, 2018 at Maun Lodge
- 4. Contractors are encouraged to register for participation in these workshops by 23rd of July 2018 at both Gaborone and Francistown Offices or through an email at mmalau@ppadb.co.bw.
- Furthermore, the Board wishes to inform the stakeholders that the basic and minimum requirements for supplies, services, works and consultancy have been reviewed. The review followed comprehensive consultations with the stakeholders in 2016 / 2017, and 2017/2018 financial years. From the consultation workshops, PPADB was able to identify areas that presented challenges to the contractors during registration and addressed them in the interest of promoting ease of doing business.
